President Rick Johnson called the meeting to order at 7:35 p.m. at Charley's Restaurant and welcomed 19 members and 4 guests, including Peggy Deyerle, Betsy Gardner, Denise Mays and Jan Hawkins. Rick welcomed member Ed Fielding after a lengthy absence. Gary Quale has undergone another knee replacement and was recuperating well so far. Rick also announced that Bob Carpenter's daughter June had been appointed to a church in Amelia, VA, and Bob would be moving there with her. It was also noted that Ed Rowland had died. He was the husband of Geneive Rowland, our Christmas banquet caterer. The members expressed their condolences to Mrs. Rowland and her family and made a \$50.00 contribution to their church in Altavista. Minutes of the May meeting were approved as distributed and the Treasurer then reported.

There was no Old Business.

There were no reports from the Vice President, National Director, Newsletter Editor or the Web Master. Chairman of the Virginia Rail Heritage Region Project, Norris Deyerle reported on Lynchburg Rail Day noting that help will be needed and chapter members could still rent tables at a reduced rate. Lynchburg Rail Day posters and fliers are available for distribution.

Lee Hawkins discussed an Amtrak regional trip on Saturday, July 23rd to Manassas as part of the Battle of Bull Run commemorations. Tickets are about \$42.00 and there would be a 4-hour layover. Rick announced he would be presenting the evening's program, due to Steve Hutchinson's illness. The July program will be presented by Fred Mayer on the Railroads of Montana. The July 27 Fun Meeting would be presented by David Helmer covering his railroad experiences in Viet Nam. Meeting adjourned at 8:51 pm.

July 1, 2011: a bad day for Amtrak in Lynchburg – Two unrelated railroad events made for some very interesting train watching in Lynchburg on July 1. Locally, it was necessary to cancel the Lynchburg Regional train on this morning due to locomotive failure. Approximately 145 passengers were scheduled to ride the train out of Lynchburg. Three chartered busses from Abbott Bus in Roanoke were substituted for the train and whisked the people away.

When things have gone wrong in the past with motive power on the Regional train an engine has been taken of the northbound Crescent and placed on the Regional. On this particular day, however, the Crescent, train #20, had been delayed in the deep south by an NS freight train derailment in Akron, AL, the day before and was running TWELVE hours late! It was of no help this day.

The passengers on the ill-fated train had been taken care of with the busses. They were gone. However, the equipment from the cancelled train remained in Lynchburg. Disabled locomotive #16 and the nine cars were still occupying the storage track at Lynchburg. This trainset needed to get out of the way in order to make room for the southbound Regional which would arrive at 8:30 p.m.

What was done to solve the problem made for the interesting train watching. The Crescent arrived into Lynchburg about 6 p.m. The disabled engine from the Regional train was taken off its train and set aside on one of the additional storage tracks at Kemper Street. After that was completed, the Crescent pulled past the switch leading into the storage track and then backed into the storage track and coupled up to the cars of the Regional. What resulted was a nineteen-car passenger train! The Fifth Street Bridge made for a great place to watch all the activity and quite a number of nice pictures were made. Some of these follow. With the departure of the Crescent the cars of the Regional were now gone. The bad engine, however, remained in town over the weekend. It was sent back to Washington on Monday morning's Regional train dead-in-tow. To reduce the chance that something might go wrong with the move an engine was taken off the Crescent and added to the Regional's consist. Thus, Train #156 on July 4 left town with three engines, #169 off the Crescent, engine #16 dead, and engine #72.

New train on the CSX James River – The semi-permanent reroute of CSXT intermodal trains Q130 and Q139 via the former C&O has occurred. Tunnel enlargement work along the former B&O in northern West Virginia is the reason. The trains run between New Baltimore, OH and Portsmouth, VA, most days of the week. The Q139 that originated in Portsmouth on June 21 was the first train to be rerouted and was seen passing through Lynchburg about 3:00 p.m. on June 22. The trains have settled into a routine, with Q139 going west through town between 10 a.m. and 2 p.m. and Q130 going east between 3 p.m. and 6 p.m.

Lynchburg Rail Day 2011 White Elephant Table Guidelines Information And Release Form

Thank you for your interest in allowing the Blue Ridge Chapter, NRHS to sell your railroad related items on a consignment basis.

Our chapter will be accepting railroad related items for consignment at our designated White Elephant Table "check-in" area at the Boonsboro Ruritan Club on 1065 Coffee Road, Route 644, off US 501 North, Lynchburg, Va. 24503. Go to www.blueridgenrhs.org for detailed directions to this location. **Do not rely solely on GPS maps** to get to the Boonsboro Ruritan Club! The **GPS maps may be incorrect!** "Check in" times are Friday, August 12, 2011 from 4:00 pm to 7:00 pm and Saturday, August 13, 2011 from 8:00 am to 10:30 am. These are the only times that there will be White Elephant Table workers available to help you check in your items. Please note that there will be no items checked in unless you have your items clearly priced and marked as described in the following guidelines.

Guidelines

- 1. All items must be railroad related. Examples include, but not limited to, model railroad locomotives, rolling stock, track, transformers, structures, railroad memorabilia, lanterns, locks, keys, china, timetables, etc.
 - NO MAGAZINES will be accepted unless they are securely bundled and priced by the BUNDLE. Collectible hard and soft cover books are encouraged and gladly accepted.
- 2. All items must be clearly identified with the **seller's three initials** and an **item number** written on a price sticker secured to the item for sale.
- 3. A **master list** to be left with the White Elephant Table staff must include what your three initials are, item description, item number, and the selling price. You must price your items. This is not an auction. There are no exceptions. No master list, no consignment. Please have your name, address, phone numbers and email address clearly printed on your master list so you can be contacted about any future shows.
- 4. **Consignment fees: 20% of the seller's marked price**. There will be a **minimum commission** payable to the Blue Ridge Chapter of **\$1.00** per item or group of items.
 - **Example 1**: A single item has the selling price of \$10.00. If sold, the seller received \$8.00 and the Blue Ridge Chapter, NRHS receives \$2.00

Example 2: A single item has the selling price of \$4.00. 20% of \$4.00 is \$.80. Since the **minimum handling charge is \$1.00**, if this item is sold, the seller will receive \$3.00. It is recommended to bag groups of small loose or inexpensive items together to sell them as a single item. This may save you money by avoiding multiple minimum handling charges. No charge to you if we don't sell your item{s}. It's Free!

Please mark all of your prices using whole dollar amounts.

- 5. Any unsold items not picked from the White Elephant Table by the end of the show will become the property of the Blue Ridge Chapter, NRHS.
- 6. **Instructions for receiving payment**: The White Elephant Table closes at 3:30 pm the day of the show. Sellers may collect the money due to them after the White Elephant Table workers finish calculating the money due to you from the sales of your items. This will take place as close to 4:00 pm as possible depending on when the White Elephant Table workers get the Blue Ridge Chapter, NRHS commissions calculated. **NO EXCEPTIONS.** The White Elephant Table workers don't have time to calculate your portion during the day. You can pick up your items at any time providing that there is someone available to help you check your sold items off of your master list. If you are unable to pick up your money, a check will be mailed to you if you supply a SASE.

7. Disclosure Statement:

Every precaution will be taken to assure the safe handling of your items. Brass locomotives and other expensive items will be shown only with the assistance of a White Elephant Table staff member. If an item needs to be test run, it will only be done with a White Elephant Table staff member or seller present. No exceptions will be made.

The Boonsboro Ruritan Club, the National Railway Historical Society, the Blue Ridge Chapter, NRHS or any member of these organizations assume no responsibility for incorrectly priced, damaged, or stolen items. The risk rests entirely upon the seller/consignor.

Connecting shuttle service between Roanoke and Lynchburg Amtrak set to begin – Roanoke Valley Metro has announced it will begin its "Smartway" bus service between Roanoke and Kemper Street Station on July 19. The service is designed to make it easier for people in the Roanoke area to connect with the Lynchburg Regional Amtrak service to the Northeast. Two round-trips per day will be made, one in the morning to connect with trains #176/#156, and one in the evening connecting from trains #171/#147/#145. The service will originate in Roanoke Monday-Thursday and will originate in Blacksburg Friday, Saturday, and Sunday. The fare is currently set at \$4/trip. Ed. Note – While I am happy that the service is set to begin, I do have a few concerns about it. Anything to reduce the number of cars coming to Kemper Street is welcomed, for sure. I understand they will be operating a 16-seat mini-bus and that no reservations are required. What will happen if twenty people with baggage show up at the Civic Center expecting a ride to Lynchburg? What then? What happens if the bus breaks down en route to Lynchburg and train connections are missed? Who's going to be responsible for that, if anyone. I guess these are things we'll have to face as they arise. In any event, it will be interesting to see how it plays out and how used the service will be.
