President Rick Johnson called the meeting to order at 7:45 pm at Charley's Restaurant and welcomed 24 members and 3 guests. The April minutes were approved as distributed. Treasurer John Tanner then reported. Chuck Haldik announced that the Southeastern Region of the NMRA will meet in Gatlinburg, TN on June 1, 2012. It will include a tour of the Dollywood steam shops.

Under old business Rick reminded everyone about the Manassas trip on August 25th. Ed Fielding reported that the VBR program in Nelson County had been rescheduled to June 17th at the Massie's Mill Ruritan Club. The chapter picnic is scheduled for September 16 in Altavista and Rick reported that he will be presenting a program on the 1978 Crescent wreck for the Rivanna Chapter. There was a discussion of the facility situation in Hamlet, NC but no action was taken.

Vice President Charlie Long reported on the upcoming N&WHS convention in Lynchburg and gave an update on the Concord, VA railway station (ex-Southside). There was no National Director report. Norris Deyerle reported on Rail Day, noting that George Riley of Carstens Publishing was contributing a display ad in Model Railroad Craftsman and several posters for use in the area. The June meeting will feature Winston-Salem Chapter member Steve Hucherson. Pete Echols send old magazines for giveaway and Gerald Duval won the 50/50. Meeting adjourned at 8:15 p.m. for a presentation by member Dale Diacont of his 2004 tour of New England railroads.

Norfolk Southern's Heritage locomotives will gather for a "family portrait" -

NORFOLK, VA. – Norfolk Southern's Heritage locomotives will gather for a "family portrait" at the North Carolina Transportation Museum (NCTM) in Spencer, N.C., during the Fourth of July week. All 20 locomotives painted in the color schemes of predecessor railroads will be on display July 3 and 4.

"This is the first and probably only chance we'll have to get all these locomotives together in one place at one time," said Norfolk Southern CEO Wick Moorman. "We're proud of the role railroads play in keeping the country's economy strong, and July 4 is an opportune time to showcase that heritage of service and safety. "Having these engines gathered together is a phenomenon, not just an event," said NCTM Executive Director Samuel Wegner. "And the N.C. Transportation Museum's Bob Julian Roundhouse is obviously a great place to frame this 'family portrait'. It's a great partnership with Norfolk Southern to host this historic occasion. "Tickets for the event are \$25 for adults and \$15 for children in advance, and \$30 for adults and \$20 for children the day of the event. Tickets apply to a single day of events. Those wishing to attend both days will need tickets for each. Nighttime photo shoots will also be held July 3 and 4. To purchase tickets to the daytime activities and the nighttime photo shoot, call 704-636-2889, ext. 237. Norfolk Southern employees and retirees will be eligible for a \$5 discount, with a limit of four tickets per purchase. Retirees must purchase tickets by phone to get the discount. The Fourth of July week was chosen because of the holiday and because demand for the locomotives in freight service temporarily will be reduced due to the traditional coal miners' holiday.

Norfolk Southern is producing the Heritage fleet as part of the company's 30th anniversary celebration. Norfolk Southern was created June 1, 1982, with the consolidation of Southern Railway Company and Norfolk and Western Railway Company, but both of those trace their lineage to hundreds of predecessors dating back to the early 1800s. The museum is on the former site of Southern Railway's Spencer Shops, a steam locomotive servicing facility. After the advent of diesel, Spencer continued to serve as a classification yard into the late 1970s, when Southern donated land and facilities to the State of North Carolina for the establishment of the museum.

Norfolk Southern invites public to help protect the rail line; Joins BNSF in expanding community rail security initiative -

NORFOLK, VA. – Norfolk Southern is making it easier for communities, businesses, and informed observers such as rail fans to report issues relating to public safety and security to the railroad's police force. The NS announcement is a significant expansion of the community-based rail security initiative started by BNSF Railway.

Everyone with a stake in rail operations is invited to join Norfolk Southern's new "Protect the Line" reporting program, an online resource that directly connects you with NS Police. By becoming a Protect the Line member at the new www.protecttheline.com website, observers can report immediately to NS Police any suspicious activity relating to equipment maintenance, track obstructions, trespassing, vandalism, suspicious items and vehicles, and terrorism.

NS' Protect the Line and BNSF's Citizens for Rail Security are part of an industry-wide initiative that works to include everyone with an interest in railroads.

"Community awareness and participation are critical to keeping the railroad line safe and secure," said David Julian, NS vice president safety and environmental. "Through Protect the Line and Citizens for Rail Security, the public can work directly with us to prevent and mitigate situations that jeopardize the railroad line and those whom we serve."

Mark Sinquefield, NS director of police, said, "Protect the Line members will be doing their part to safeguard America's critical commerce network by serving as responsible additional eyes and ears for railroads and our employees."

"More than 10,000 citizens have joined the Citizens for Rail Security effort and are making the rail network a safer place by reporting potential trespassers, stolen equipment, and suspicious behavior near the tracks," said Duwayne Pennington, BNSF's assistance vice president of Resource Protection.

Interested people can access the Protect the Line website a number of different ways: directly at www.protecttheline.com, through the Norfolk Southern website at www.nscorp.com, and through BNSF's Citizens for Rail Security website at www.citizensforrailsecurity.com. Visitors are encouraged to register by clicking Protect the Line and providing contact information. The Protect the Line website explains more about the program, including a link to BNSF's site.

Stay tuned. NS is developing an update to its smartphone app, NS Corp, that will include access to Protect the Line, with enhanced communications capabilities.

The NS and BNSF police forces are charged with safeguarding people and freight shipments over the systems. They work closely with local, state, and federal law enforcement agencies to protect railroads and communities.

21st Century Steam excursion train trips scheduled for June in North Carolina and Virginia NORFOLK, VA. and CHATTANOOGA, TENN. - If you have been waiting to ride a train behind a century-old steam locomotive, here is your chance.

As part of the 21st Century Steam program of Norfolk Southern and the Tennessee Valley Railroad Museum, excursions are being offered in June in North Carolina and Virginia behind steam locomotive 630.

- June 16-17, Spencer to Barber, N.C., and return

 Host: North Carolina Transportation Museum
- Train departures from museum: 9 a.m., 12:15 p.m., and 3:30 p.m. each day
- Route: Norfolk Southern "S-Line" between Spencer and Barber, 24-mile round trip
- Power: steam locomotive 630 only (no diesels assisting)
- Equipment: air-conditioned coaches with reclining seats and large picture windows
- Fare: \$35 adults, \$25 children ages 3-12. Children 2 and under not occupying seats do not require tickets.

June 23, Spencer to Winston-Salem, N.C., one way (bus return)

Southern Railway 630, the steam locomotive featured on these trains, is a Consolidation-type locomotive built in 1904 at the Richmond, Va., works of the American Locomotive Company. Number 630 pulled freight trains during the first half of the last century, mostly in North Carolina, and in the 1960s and '70s traveled extensively in excursion service throughout the Southeast. Small of size but big in character, this locomotive underwent an exhaustive 10-year rehabilitation at TVRM's Soule Shops complex in East Chattanooga before returning to service in 2011.

Tennessee Valley Railroad Museum was founded in 1961 in Chattanooga to create an interpretive operating museum of historic equipment and artifacts in an authentic setting. Today it operates an extensive schedule of historic and scenic trains in Southeast Tennessee and Northwest Georgia, supported by its East Chattanooga locomotive and shop complex. TVRM is the largest operating historical excursion railroad in the Southeast.

21st Century Steam is a partnership between Norfolk Southern and TVRM to operate steam-powered excursions throughout the territory Norfolk Southern serves. More information is available on the 21st Century Steam website at www.21stcenturysteam.com.
