Wayland Moore will present the show at the March meeting of the Blue Ridge Chapter, NRHS. He's entitled it "Work Made Me Do It" or "A Pot Poured full of Pretty Pictures" PART 1. It's a collection of photos from some of the places and trains that he found when traveling for work.

Wayland comments: "Traveling for work has both positives and negatives. Time is taken from home; unpacking and repacking; losing out on things around the home, including missing the Blue Ridge Chapter meetings among them. Traveling involves having to travel in bad weather, canceled flights, finding a place to stay on short notice, missing sleep, being in closed spaces with people spreading colds, etc., irritable kids, trying to find new addresses for the client, the hotel and where to eat and having food that is loaded with the three main food groups - fat, sugar and salt.

"On the other side of the coin is seeing new places and finding new things or revisits to places previously enjoyed and, in one case the year before last, by staying over a day at my own expense and firing again on a steam engine -- this one being a 4-6-2, L&N 152. It gave me a chance to challenge Ed Fielding's knowledge. One time I left him a phone message: 'It's black with the number 420', then held the phone so the locomotive could be heard, followed with the same for number 425. Then the question to him is, 'Where was I and what railroad?' Another time it was telling him I was crossing the Canadian River headed to a shortline that used the initials of the owner's grandkids. He got both of them.

"This Part 1 goes back two weeks short of seven years to the time of taking along a pocket point-and-shoot digital camera. Hope you enjoy the program that will be my first effort at a digital show and first effort with PowerPoint."

Minutes of Meeting - February 9, 2011**

President Rick Johnson called the meeting to order at 7:30 p.m. at Charley's Restaurant and welcomed 22 members and 3 guests. He reported that Dr. Earl Guthrow had eye surgery and was recovering. The Fun Meeting in January was cancelled due to snow. Minutes were approved as distributed and the Treasurer then reported.

Under Old Business: Dues are due and should be mailed to Rick as soon as possible. Lee Hawkins described this year's circle trip to Richmond, Washington and Lynchburg on Saturday May 7. Seats were still available and a circular was distributed. Lee stressed that riders needed to be confirmed for a bus seat before making Amtrak reservations.

Under New Business: Tom Ledford described the locomotive preservation project being undertaken by the Portsmouth Rail Museum and suggested that the museum be considered for a grant from this year's Rail Day proceeds. Rick reminded members that they were invited to the reception for the opening of the "Thoroughbreds of Steam" exhibit at the Virginia Museum of Transportation. He also reminded members about Howard Gregory's talk in Appomattox on March 9th. On March 23rd Aubrey Wiley will present a program at the fun meeting and a follow-up walking tour on March 26th on narrow-gauge logging railroads in Amherst County. Details are in the February *Bulletin*. Rick circulated a request for information about the N&W's *Powhatan Arrow* for a forthcoming book.

Norris Deyerle reported on Virginia Rail Heritage Region activities, reminding members about the C&OHS show at Clifton Forge on February 26-27. The Blue Ridge Chapter will have a White Elephant table there and volunteers are needed. There were no other reports. Gary Quale asked about placing some of Ralph's slides on the chapter web page for members only. Lloyd Lipscomb won the 50/50 and the meeting adjourned at 8:05 p.m.

Dale Diacont presented a program of slides from some of his recent travels. He also donated a \$20 gift certificate from Charlie's which was won by Gerald Duval as part of the 50/50 drawing.

**"South River Lumber Company of Amherst, Nelson and Rockbridge Counties:
A fifty-seven-mile long narrow gauge railroad"
March 23 Fun Meeting program by Aubrey Wiley**

Aubrey says, "I guarantee that anyone who attends the program and the field trip on the following Saturday, will form lifelong memories!" Little has been published or is even known about this interesting web of a logging railroad right in our own area. Its gauge is unusual, 42", and it operated five Climax locomotives. Operating from 1916 to 1938, the company's saw mill, located beside N&W's Shenandoah line, produced over one hundred million board feet. The program will include pictures (samples on next page) of every locomotive, vintage pictures of the operation, as well as contemporary pictures of what can be found today.

The Saturday, March 26, road trip will leave from Lowe's Madison Heights parking lot (the side nearest the library) at 8:45. We will drive to Amherst and head west on route 60 for the mountains. From Lowe's to the end of our tour at about 2:00pm for our lunch stop in Buena Vista, we will travel 66 miles. As we visit remaining examples of the railroad grade and operations, we will enjoy some of the most beautiful scenery in the east! Arrange your own car pools, keeping in mind that about 20 miles will be on back roads, some unpaved and moderately steep in just a couple places. (In case of inclement weather on March 26, we will reschedule for Saturday, April 9. Call Aubrey at 434-386-2226 if in doubt.)

Lynchburg-Richmond- Washington (or Alexandria)-Lynchburg.
Celebrating National Train Day and Amtrak's 40th Anniversary. Saturday, May 7, 2011**

Once again the Blue Ridge Chapter, NRHS, is planning a charter bus / train circle trip around the Commonwealth of Virginia, similar to what we did last year. All Blue Ridge Chapter members and their friends are invited. **PLEASE NOTE THIS IMPORTANT CHANGE TO OUR ITINERARY!!!** We've had to alter it slightly since our initial announcement.

The schedule of our Richmond-to-Washington train has been changed! As a result we'll be leaving Lynchburg earlier, but we'll have a little more time to spend in Washington. **TAKE NOTE!** Now leave from Kemper Street Station at 5:45 a.m. via chartered bus for Richmond's Main Street Station arriving about 8:15 a.m. Spend a little time in the downtown / Shockoe Bottom neighborhood of Richmond near the famous Triple Crossing. Board Amtrak train #194 at 9:30 a.m. departing from Main Street Station traveling over the former RF&P. See from the train ACCA Yard, Staples Mill Rd. Station, Ashland, Doswell, Ruther Glen, Penola, Guinea (where Stonewall Jackson died), Meade's Marker, Fredericksburg, Rappahannock River Bridge, Aquia Creek Bridge, Quantico, Powell's Creek Bridge (near the power plant), Neabsco Bridge, Occoquan River Bridge, Lorton - Auto Train terminal, Southern Ry. connection right into Alexandria Union Station. Arrive in Alexandria at 11:50 a.m.

If you wish to detrain in Alexandria have lunch, perhaps, at Joe Theismann's Restaurant next to station. Other restaurants close by include Five Guys and Hard Times Café. Or tour King Street - free street shuttle every 10 minutes to the Potomac River and back; or the George Washington Masonic National Monument; or just hang out at Alexandria's Union Station and watch trains. Catch NEC Regional train #147 in Alexandria at 4:17 p.m. arriving in Lynchburg at 7:39 p.m.

OR, if you wish, you might want to book your train ticket into Washington rather than Alexandria. Amtrak will be celebrating National Train Day in a big way this year at Union Station. Amtrak's 40th anniversary is May 1, 2011, and many exhibits and equipment displays will be open to the public commemorating this milestone event on May 7 at Washington Union Station. Many, many restaurants are available in the Food Court in the station. Our train is due into Washington at 12:20 p.m. The train to Lynchburg departs Washington at 4:00 p.m.

Right now the cost to travel on the two trains via Alexandria is \$44. The fare to go into Washington is \$52. These fares could go up if bookings on one or both trains begin to increase. You will be responsible for booking your own rail transportation. Our Chapter rail travel consultant, Garland Harper, can assist you in booking. He is on duty at Kemper Street Station Wednesday thru Sunday 4pm – midnight. 434-847-8247. If you are internet savvy, book on-line at www.amtrak.com.

The Chapter is reserving the chartered bus to Richmond. This portion of the trip will cost \$35.00 per person. The cost will be non-refundable unless the trip is canceled. The Blue Ridge Chapter, NRHS, will make every effort to sell enough bus tickets to have the trip and not put a financial burden on the chapter.

**Connecting bus service for rail passengers to Lynchburg funded in budget

The budget adopted by the General Assembly on Feb. 27 provides \$150,000 for a yearlong bus service between Roanoke and the Amtrak passenger station on Kemper Street in Lynchburg. The funds become available July 1 and are designated for Roanoke city to set up and operate a "bus bridge" for one year. The budget's language calls it "a one-year ridership demonstration project" and says nothing about the project's future.

Courtney Ware, a spokeswoman for the state Department of Rail and Public Transportation, said Monday the department could not say when the service would begin. Gov. Bob McDonnell has not yet signed the legislation, and details also will have to be worked out with Roanoke's local transit service, which will operate the bus.

The State Department of Rail and Public Transportation issued a study in December that indicated the bus could have 3,600 riders per year. The study projected that they would pay \$3 per ride. The DRPT report said local governments in the Roanoke-to-Lynchburg corridor would be expected to contribute to the cost of the bus service.

The bus would connect Roanoke and Bedford-area riders to the Northeast Regional train that departs from Lynchburg at 7:38 a.m. on weekdays, 9:59 a.m. on weekends, headed toward Washington, New York and Boston. The train's return trip arrives in Lynchburg at 8:36 p.m. on weekdays.
